10 DAYS OF REPENTANCE

A PRAYER GUIDE FOR THE DAYS OF AWE

Introduction

The 10 Days of Awe, beginning on Yom Teruah, Feast of Trumpets, and ending on Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, are set apart as a time of repentance, reflection and renewal. As we await the second coming of our Messiah, Yeshua, we have been given dress rehearsals to put into practice. One day, the trumpet will blow and we will usher in his return. Judgement Day will be sealed forever, and only those with their names in the Book of Life will be saved. (Revelation 20:15) In his mercy, the Father allows us to “get it right” here on earth with cyclical reminders of repentance and cleansing. These 10 days remind us that Adonai is both Judge and Redeemer, calling his people to return to him with sincere hearts. Think of it as your yearly job review: how well have I done and what do I need to work on in the coming year? It is time to take inventory of the talents we’ve been given.

This prayer guide, 10 Days of Repentance, is designed to help you walk through these holy days with intentionality. Each day focuses on one of the Ten Commandments given in Exodus 20, using them as a mirror to reflect on our lives, our choices, and our need for Adonai’s mercy. These commandments are not only laws but also vows of the covenant and an invitation into a life of holiness, worship, and love toward Adonai and others.

For each day you will find:

- Scriptures to pray and meditate upon.
- Suggested prayer to guide your repentance.
- Each commandment rephrased as a marriage vow to the Father.
- Journaling space for honest reflection before the LORD.

The goal is not to create guilt or condemnation, but to lead you into repentance that brings restoration. As Paul reminds us, “God’s kindness is meant to lead you to repentance” (Romans 2:4). These ten days give us the opportunity to lay aside every weight, confess where we have fallen short, and realign our hearts with the LORD.

May this guide help you enter into the awe of these appointed days, drawing you nearer to Adonai as you prepare your heart for the cleansing and renewal of Yom Kippur. I pray you are led into a deeper relationship with the Father through the work of his Son and the power of his Spirit during these vital days.

Day 1: Following other gods

Exodus 20:2-3 - *I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. "You shall have no other gods before me."*

Deuteronomy 6:4-5 - *Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might."*

Isaiah 45:5 — *"I am the LORD, and there is no other, besides me there is no God."*

**Other scriptures: Psalm 86:11; Exodus 34:14; Matthew 6:24*

Today's focus of repentance:

- Ways, doctrines, thoughts or actions that glorify any other god, intentionally or unintentionally
- How have I put other people, objects, hobbies, traditions, and desires before the Father?
- How have I rejected His leadership, guidance, lordship, or fatherhood?
- How have I not loved Him with my entire being, in word and action?
- How often do I act in selfishness with no desire to please the LORD?

Prayer Guide

Father, I repent for any and every way I have not glorified, praised and loved you the way you deserve to be loved. Please forgive me and show me the areas in my life that I have chosen to spend my time and given devotion to that are not you. I choose this day forward to love you with my entire being: mind, body, heart and soul. I reject any and all other foreign gods. Show me the ways I am not serving you or giving you my entire self. Forgive me and cleanse me, and give me understanding, revelation and knowledge in areas I do not yet know. Show yourself to me that I may know you fully. In Yeshua's name. Amen.

Today's Vow

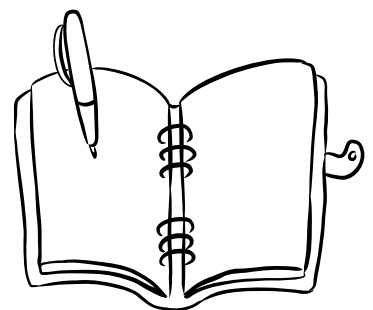

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Day 2: Idols

Exodus 20:4-6 - *You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and the fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing steadfast love to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments.”*

Jeremiah 25:6 - *Do not go after other gods to serve and worship them, or provoke me to anger with the work of your hands.*

Other scriptures: 1 Corinthians 10:1-22; Psalm 106; Deuteronomy 6

Today's focus of repentance:

- Traditions, thought patterns, struggles, people, objects, addictions or actions that keep me in bondage to anything other than YHWH
- Is my first tendency to lean on the Father in hard times, or do I turn to something else?
- Do I have any physical idols in my home? (ie: visited other countries and brought back buddhas, carved images devoted to other gods, objects used in other religions)
- Who gets my full devotion?
- Do I fully trust God to meet my needs and not look elsewhere for fulfillment?

Prayer Guide

Father, I repent for serving other gods. I repent for having dependence, reliance and devotion to any thing, object or person that is not you. I renounce the gods of this world, their idols, their traditions, their requirements, and their statutes. Show me areas of ignorance where I have unintentionally aligned with other gods. I choose this day to only bow my head to serve you, honor you, and revere you. Forgive me, cleanse me and help me in times of struggle. Help me to lean on you, love you, and serve you with all my might, strength and heart. In Yeshua's name. Amen.

Today's Vow

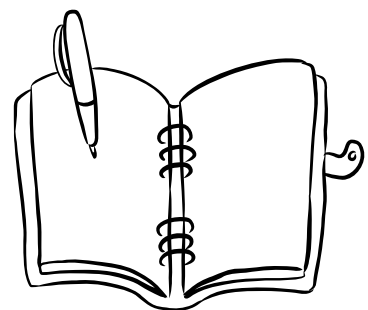

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Day 3: Not Honoring the Name

Exodus 20:7 - *You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain.*

Leviticus 22:31-32 — *“So you shall keep my commandments and do them: I am the LORD. And you shall not profane my holy name, that I may be sanctified among the people of Israel.”*

Other scriptures: 2 Timothy 2:19; Psalm 19:14; Ezekiel 36:20-23

Today's focus of repentance:

- Words or actions that have misrepresented, tarnished, defamed or trampled upon the name of Yahweh
- Do I claim to know the LORD by word but not by action? Do I walk the walk?
- Have I misled, misguided, or created doubt in another about who Yah is?
- Have I trampled on his name by not representing him correctly to others?
- Have I ruined his reputation by my actions or words?
- Have I used his name for my own advantage - to seek out my own name instead?
- Am I honoring the vows I made when I entered into covenant with him?

Prayer Guide

Father, I repent for every way I have misrepresented you and your name. I ask you to forgive me for using your name for my own advantage and seeking out my own desires instead of yours. I repent for flippantly using your name without knowing or understanding the power behind it. I choose to honor your name, as a wife takes her husband's name, and to stand firm in my faith in you. Forgive me, cleanse me and help me to always represent you and point others to you, with not just my words but my actions. In Yeshua's name. Amen.

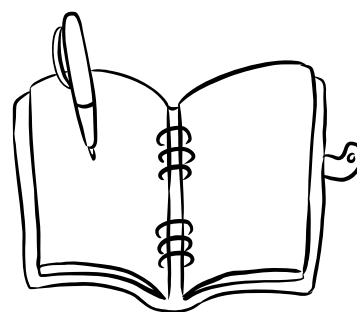

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Day 4: Sabbath

Exodus 20:8-11 - *“Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD, your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy.”*

Mark 2:27-28 - *And he said to them, “The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. So the Son of Man is lord even of the Sabbath.”*

Leviticus 23:3 - *“Six days shall work be done, but on the seventh day is a Sabbath of solemn rest, a holy convocation. You shall do no work. It is a Sabbath to the LORD in all your dwelling places.”*

Hebrews 4:9-10 — *“So then, there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God, for whoever has entered God’s rest has also rested from his works as God did from his.”*

Other scriptures:

*Jeremiah 17:19-27; Isaiah 58: 13-14; Ezekiel 20; Nehemiah 13:19-22;

Today’s focus of repentance:

- Ways in which I do not keep the true biblical Sabbath by ceasing from work, not setting it apart, replacing it with another day or ignore another’s needs
- Do I know what it means to truly stop working for 24 hours?
- Do I honor the weekly Sabbath day as instituted in Scripture?
- How have I kept the Sabbath holy (set apart) from the other six days?
- Do I even know what rest truly means?
- What does rest look like to me today and how can it change to the biblical way and correct biblical day?
- How have I let busyness and stress dictate my life, attitude, tendencies and behavior? How have these things affected my relationship with the LORD?

Day 4: Sabbath

Prayer Guide

Father, I repent for not setting aside the true Sabbath day as a rest day with you. Please show me how I can better honor it, how I can rest, and how to lay down my work and duties for the entire day. Show me how to make it holy, and show me how I am not setting it apart now. Please forgive my ignorance, apathy, contentment, and rebellion against this day. Please provide the way for me to financially cease working on Sabbath and continue on this path with you. Show me more of yourself and what this day means to you so I can be more like you and follow in your footsteps. May I never be so blind and selfish to only act in my way but use this day to help others as well. In Yeshua's name. Amen.

Today's Vow

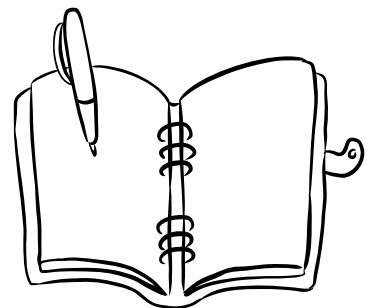

Proverbs 23:22 - *Listen to your father who begot you, and do not despise your mother when she is old.*

Other scriptures:

Mark 15:1-20; Ephesians 6:1-4; Proverbs 1:8-9; Deuteronomy 5:16; Proverbs 19:20; Proverbs 30:17; Hebrews 13:17

Today's focus of repentance:

- Actions, words, rebellion, dishonor, gossip, slander, disobedience, or insubordination to those that raised me and guided me in the LORD
- Forgiveness, not acceptance, of parental behavior that affected the course of my life negatively and setting appropriate boundaries
- Breaking of generational curses, strongholds, tendencies, or addictions in my bloodline that could be passed down to further generations
- Do I honor my earthly parents with respect, understanding, service, and positive attitude?
- How can I serve my parents/guardians better in the coming year?
- If my parents have passed away, how can I take what I learned from them and pass it on to my children? What did they teach me that will affect generations?
- Am I holding onto grudges, unforgiveness, traditions or ways that are not of the LORD that I was taught?
- Have I stood firm in my faith in the LORD and taken a stand for righteousness even if my earthly parents disagree?
- How am I raising my own children to be respectful of elders, listen to instruction and be an example to others?

Day 5: Honoring of Parents

Prayer Guide

Father, I repent for every way, intentionally or unintentionally, that I have dishonored, disrespected, or mistreated my earthly parents. Show me how I can better serve them by representing you in everything I do. Cleanse my bloodline of all ways that are contrary to you, break every stronghold that has been passed down and every addiction, rebellion, and curse that has had a hold on my family. Forgive me for harboring unforgiveness and grudges, and help me to set the appropriate boundaries in my life. Walk me through how to forgive and heal. Show me your fatherly love, wrap your arms around me and guide me into your family. I choose this day to represent you, even if it means going against how I was raised or brought up. Help me to love, honor and cherish others in authority while standing firm for you. Guide me as I lead my own children in your ways and statutes that they may teach their children and continue to impact generations through their obedience. In Yeshua's name. Amen.

Today's Vow

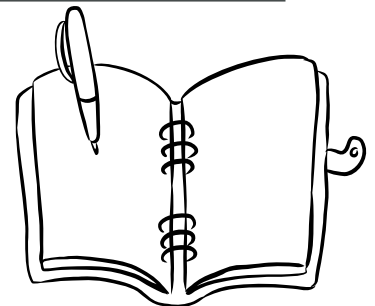

Day 6: Murder

Exodus 20:13 - *You shall not murder.*

1 John 3:15 - *Whoever hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him.*

1 John 4:20-21 - *If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen? And this commandment we have from Him: that he who loves God must love his brother also.*

Proverbs 10:12 - *Hatred stirs up strife, but love covers all offenses.*

Other scriptures:

Mathew 5: 21-26; Ephesians 4:31-32; Luke 6:27; Proverbs 6:16-19

Today's focus of repentance:

- Physical act of murder
- Hatred that stems from the heart toward another person(s)
- Anger toward another person(s) that has caused bitterness, resentment, or unforgiveness to build in my heart
- Lack of self control, fits of rage, outbursts of anger, frustration, unkindness, mean-spirited talk, gossip or slander - intentionally or unintentionally
- Who do I need to forgive, or ask forgiveness from, to release the anger and bitterness in my heart?
- In what ways has anger or hatred been passed down in my family?
- What door do I have open that is allowing a spirit of anger to take root in my heart?
- Am I angry at the LORD?
- Ask the LORD to show you how to release anger, frustration, hatred, hurt, pain, or trauma that has taken root in your heart as the seed of murder

Day 6: Murder

Prayer Guide

Father, I repent for physical, emotional, and spiritual murder. I repent for having hatred, anger, frustration, outbursts of rage and unkindness in my heart. Take these seeds far from me and replace them with your love. Show me how to love those who persecute me or have abused me. Teach me your ways so I may be more like you and love like you do. I choose this day to honor you with my heart, love you and others in word and action and forgive those that have wronged me. Forgive me of gossip and slander of all kinds. Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit in me. Cleanse my bloodline of anger and hatred, and help me ingest clean, holy and pure things so they flow out of my heart and mouth. In Yeshua's name. Amen.

Today's Vow

"I promise to not hold hatred, anger or frustration in my heart toward You or another person so that I may reflect Your kindness that leads others to repentance."

Day 7: Adultery

Exodus 20:14 - *You shall not commit adultery.*

Matthew 5:27-28 - *You have heard that it was said, “You shall not commit adultery.” But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart.*

Hebrews 13:4 - *Let the marriage be held in honor among all, and let the marriage bed be undefiled, for God will judge the sexually immoral and adulterous.*

1 Thessalonians 4:3-5 - *For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you abstain from sexual immorality; that each one of you know how to control his own body in holiness and honor, not in the passion of lust like the Gentiles who do not know God.*

Other scriptures:

James 1:14-15; 1 John 2:16; 1 Corinthians 6:18

Today's focus of repentance:

- Physical acts of intimacy with anyone outside of marriage sanctioned by the LORD (man and woman)
- Lust, longing, perversion, intimacy, pornography, and unfaithfulness done in secret
- Uncontrolled thoughts, feelings or actions that lead to physical or emotional actions or feelings toward someone other than my spouse
- Open gateways in the mind that allow for a seed of lust to take root
- Purposeful intentions to seduce and lead another away from their spouse
- Generational iniquity of adultery, intimacy outside of marriage, homosexuality and perversion
- Unfaithfulness to the LORD and the covenant I made with him through his Son
- Addiction that leads to poor judgement, decisions, thoughts and actions
- How can I better serve, honor, cherish and love my spouse?
- How can I prepare myself now for the spouse the LORD has for me? How can I set myself apart?
- What open doors do I have in my life that leave the enemy room to plant seeds of lust and perversion?

Day 7: Adultery

Prayer Guide

Father, I repent for any and every act of adultery whether physical or in thought. I repent for lust of the eyes, flesh and heart that have led me astray from my spouse and you. I repent for every act of pornography, every open gateway in my mind and every purposeful intention to be unfaithful. Cleanse my soul, my mind and my body, and help me in my struggles. Thank you for always providing a way out of temptation. I choose this day to be a loyal and pure person, to seek your kingdom and to serve and honor my spouse. I break every generational iniquity of sexual sin in my bloodline and declare that it has no power of me or my children. Forgive me, Father, wash me clean. I turn back to you in mind, body, soul and spirit. In the name of Yeshua. Amen.

Today's Vow

"I promise to be a sanctified follower of Yeshua by being faithful to my spouse and to put away all forms of sexual immorality. I promise to be true to You, LORD, by always being faithful and loyal to our covenant."

Day 8: Theft

Exodus 20:15 - *You shall not steal.*

Ephesians 4:28 - *Let the thief no longer steal, but rather let him labor, doing honest work with his own hands, so that he may have something to share with anyone need.*

Isaiah 61:8 - *For I the LORD love justice; I hate robbery and wrong...*

Acts 20:35 - *In all things I have shown you that by working hard in this way we must help the weak and remember the words of Messiah Yeshua, how he himself said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive."*

Galatians 6:7 - *Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap.*

Other scriptures:

*Leviticus 6:1-7; Jeremiah 7:9-11; 1 Corinthians 6:9-11;
Proverbs 15:27*

Today's focus of repentance:

- Physical acts of theft of another person, organization or entity's finances, belongings or property
- Secret schemes of extortion, robbery, bribery, manipulation or control to obtain that which is not mine or I've worked to earn
- Greedy and selfish motives
- Poor attitude or jealousy that leads to "stealing" another's joy and happiness in times of rejoicing
- Keeping others from receiving that which is rightfully theirs to have (ie; inheritance, money, willed items or property, job promotions)
- How am I stealing from someone else in motive, thought or action?
- How do greed and selfishness affect my life, family, job, and relationships?

Day 8: Theft

Prayer Guide

Father, I repent to you for every act of theft I have done in action or thought. Forgive me for every selfish desire and greedy motive that is in my heart, and show me how to work hard for what I have. I repent for a selfish and negative attitude and behavior towards others that has stolen away their joy, happiness, rejoicing and excitement. I confess every secret in my heart and every action of theft in which I'm currently involved. Forgive me for my actions. Lead me in the way of righteousness. n Yeshua's name. Amen.

Today's Vow

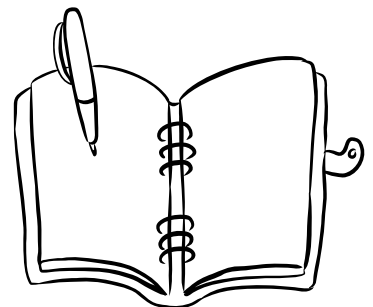

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Day 9: Lying and False Witness

Exodus 20:14 - *You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.*

Proverbs 12:22 - *Lying lips are an abomination to the LORD, but those who act faithfully are his delight.*

Ephesians 4:25 - *Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another.*

Proverbs 14:5 - *A faithful witness does not lie, but a false witness breathes out lies.*

Other scriptures:

Proverbs 25:18; John 8:44; Proverbs 6:17;

Psalms 101:7; Colossians 3:9

Today's focus of repentance:

- False words, motives, intentions or pretenses, spoken or unspoken
- Discord, gossip, slander, and rumors
- Intentional deception by creating false narratives
- Twisting the truth to my advantage ("white lies")
- Using Scripture out of context and cherry-picking verses to justify my actions, words and motives - ultimately lying to myself and leading others astray
- Alignment with lying spirits resulting in shame, guilt and condemnation
- Lies to cover up the fear of being exposed or judged
- Perfectionism, false reality, and false identity
- Confession of secrets of abuse, infidelity, theft, and/or wrongdoing that would bring healing to my mind, body, soul and spirit - no matter the cost
- Willing participation in the downfall of another's reputation, character or integrity
- How am I currently participating in false words? What is the root cause?
- Have my words caused harm to someone else or their reputation?

Day 9: Lying and False Witness

Prayer Guide

Father, I repent for every lie that has come out of my mouth. Take the seeds in my heart that have been sown in deception and expose them with your truth. Break every lying spirit over me that has convinced me to walk in shame, guilt and condemnation over my actions. I confess to you all the lies that I've kept in secret and every motive of my heart that is impure in intention. I repent for bearing false witness against others by creating deception, confusion, gossip, rumors or false narratives to sow discord. Show me in your Word where I am using it out of context to further my own desires and beliefs. I choose this day to be a person of integrity and to speak truth in love. In Yeshua's name. Amen.

Today's Vow

"I promise to speak truth in love, to not create dissension or discord and be an example to my generation through my speech in order to bring more people into covenant with You."

Day 10: Covetousness

Exodus 20:14 - *You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male servant, or his female servant, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is your neighbor's.*

Luke 12:15 - *And he said to them, "Take care, and be on your guard against all covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions."*

Ephesians 5:5 - *For you may be sure of this, that everyone who is sexually immoral or impure, or who is covetous (that is, an idolater), has no inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God.*

Hebrews 13:5 - *Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have, for he has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you."*

Other scriptures:

Ephesians 5:3; Luke 12:15-21; Mark 7:20-23

Today's focus of repentance:

- Consistent and persistent desire for people, material things, reputation, fame, or fortune that I do not have and belongs to someone else
- Ungratefulness and discontentment for the life you have
- The longing for "more" (money, bigger car, bigger house, better job)
- Breaking the root of covetousness so that it doesn't flourish into an action
- Overspending, unreasonable debt, gambling, or addictions that negatively affect my life to try to uphold an image I've created to be like someone else
- Secret desires that have led to secret sin
- What areas in my life am I unsatisfied? Am I looking elsewhere to fulfill this dissatisfaction?
- Am I hiding a secret desire for someone or something that I don't have?
- How can I practice gratefulness for my life?

Day 10: Covetousness

Prayer Guide

Father, I repent for longing for anything other than you. Forgive me for wanting what others possess, not being content with my life and always wanting more. Teach me how to love myself, my life and the people in which I have relationship. I break every root of evil desire and yearning in my heart of dissatisfaction and ungratefulness. Cleanse my hands and purify my heart. Show me the areas in my life that need improving so that I can be content, fulfilled and ready to complete the assignment on my life. In Yeshua's name. Amen.

Today's Vow

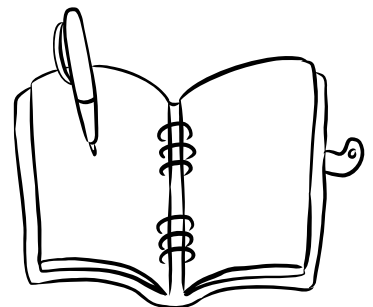

Each day of the Ten Days of Awe has been an invitation to turn from sin, to lay down idols, to mend relationships, and to realign your life with the will of God as we await our Messiah.

The days between Yom Teruah and Yom Kippur are a gift of mercy — a season of self-examination, humility, and repentance. They remind us that the God who judges is also the God who forgives. He is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love (Exodus 34:6). As you go forward from Yom Kippur, carry with you the lessons of these days: a tender conscience, a heart of gratitude, and a life that honors the Name you bear.

May the LORD seal you for life, restore what has been broken, and draw you ever nearer to him. May your prayers rise before him as a sweet offering, and may your life reflect the beauty of his holiness.
